

*R*eligion is one of the driving forces behind many of the incidents

,attitudes and events that have formed and shaped our world .in the history of the human and throughout the centuries Lord have been enacted ,and countries have been established and demolished and destroyed and wars have been fought , all to declare promulgate and support one religion or another .but deposit the human activates and hostilities toward religions ,many religions such as the so- called Semitic on Abrahamic religions heritage are of common roots and elements . These Abrahamic religions, Judaism, Christianity and Islam are monotheistic religions. They believe that there is only one God . Jews and Muslims greatly emphasize the oneness of God .The affirmation of oneness of God is misunderstood by Christians', because they believe that the one God is triune (the idea of trinity),although they say that ,this is not the denial of monotheism ,but an affirmation of oneness. Christianity and Islam in the Quran and new testament ,speak of one God who is creator of the world and all that is in the world .There is one difference between Christianity and Islamic on the oneness God. Christians believe that God has 3 faces. The first God is the Father . This is God in the old testament .Second ,there is God the Son , Jesus as Christ .Finally ,there is the holy spirit .The three are considered to be one in the same time; just different names for different faces .This is not the belief in Islam . Muslims believe that considering God to be three parts contradicts the oneness of God. Also a Christian believing in the crucifixion of Jesus would have a hard them reconciling two principles in which he believes ,namely ;Jesus is God ,and Jesus was crucified . A crucified person cannot be God , because he is unable to protect himself ,let alone be almighty. .A Muslim, on the other hand does not have such a problem .he believes that Jesus is a prophet and no more . A prophet is not supposed to be almighty

The Muslims and Christians have holy Books that teach the will of God for mankind .They are similar in form and beliefs, but they have key differences. The New Testament is part of the Christian scripture ,and the Quran is the Islamic scripture. Both books have a law for believers to fallow , and they both are believers to relieve the one true God .

The differences mainly lie in the interpretations of these scriptures and about their origins . The New testament is not the original words gospel sent down to Jesus .they have been altered over the years ;there have been numerous different versions of the bible over the years. Some include parts books that the others do not . The bible was changed over history ,and serious distortions have crept in to the Hebrew Bible , which was the true word of God to Jesus Christ .

Both scriptures believe that god has spoken to men through the prophets .inspire the view of Christians believe that their holy book is written by men , under Gods guidance, By contrast the Quran is considered to be God's word directly and unchanged and is literally God s word on paper .

Both religions consider prayer as an integral part for communication to God. Five times prayer a day (Allah)is obligatory in Islam . This is not a point for debate in Islam . A similar prayer in Christianity is also stressed ,but there is no prescribed times to do so .Muslims have set prayers to do five times a day . They are exact and always said in Arabic . This is a point of unity among the Muslims, and all Muslims throughout the world pray the exact words ,and in the same way, at the same time-in relation to the positions of the sun .

Also the Christians have prayers as the Lord's prayer yet the Christians are not required to do any of these prayers and many prays in their own individual ways. There is no fixed time to pray for Christians .

Another aspect in both religions is fasting. A Muslims are obliged to fast during the day light hours of Ramadan month if they have physical health. Christians have no set times to fast, although it is practiced .Both religions order fast to grow closer to God. Morality is of signification points in both religions. Drunkenness, adultery, suicide, homosexuality, and other acts generally considered immoral and are forbidden in both religions. Both also believe that God punishes the worship of any other except Him. There are some differences but few are major.

For Muslims morality means legality, but for Christians it does not. Another belief of both Muslims and Christians is salvation both believe in life after death, and that the human has a spirit (in Islam) or soul

(in Christianity)that is eternal even after the death of our physical body . Both agree that this soul either ends up in paradise (heaven) or hell, based on a person's actions on earth .Entry to paradise, in Islamic is based on faith in God (Allah), and righteous works .Entry to heaven in Christianity is based on faith in Christ and profession of this faith, and through the faith in Christ , they may enter the paradise.

we ,hereby, can draw a conclusion that both religions, Islam and Christianity ,have many similar aspects, and features. There are a few details that are different; but their conceptual features are the same in each religion .

There is one God, ultimate in power, who created and nurtured the whole world and who rules the world . Time is not cyclic and there is reward or punishment for the just and evil after death ,either eternal paradise or hell. Muslims and Christians are “people of the book “and the: people of God “ who share a similar history and similar beliefs about God . Both believe that the duty of people is to read or listen to God s Holy writings, and to respond with prayer ,praise and appropriate acceptance of God s commandments in our life –style; and they are closely linked religion and morality .Religion is to be manifested by showing concern for brotherhood the well- being and dignity of others and in a life of service to others , and in personal and social-ethical behavior, though we see the more perfection style of belief and actions in Islam ,and that principle discussed in Islam in prophet Muhammad word “my brother Jesus and masses and the rest .
